However, effective 15 September 2019, department will no longer process member applications from the chapters. Chapters will submit applications directly to national and once processed Department will either reimburse the chapter or add \$20 to the member's account. A policy letter describing these changes and an SOP has been sent to the chapter commanders and adjutants.

Please encourage all your Chapter and Auxiliary members to sign up new members. Remember that Chapter members can sign up Auxiliary and vice versa. I hope you all have a great year for membership.

Our bylaws are the standards by which we run our Department and Chapters. They are simply the rules and procedures by which we govern ourselves, conduct our Conventions and Chapter meetings.
