There are big changes coming in the area of "Caretaker Benefits" for all era veterans.

We are awaiting 5 new vehicles ordered in November 2017. In addition, the National DAV Headquarters has donated an additional vehicle to the Tucson Medical Center, which was presented to them at the National Convention.





Additionally, your staff participated in many committee meetings and attended quite a few seminars. One of those topics covered by a seminar was social media. Social media consists of sites like Facebook, Twitter and Instagram and they can all be used to help keep in touch with your membership base, as well as the community you serve. Even the Department of Arizona has a Facebook page (https://www.facebook.com/DAVofAz/) that we hope you will find and like us.

For the first time ever, we broadcast the opening session of our state convention on Facebook. If you weren't able to join us, the video is still there so you can check in on us and see some of our guest speakers and awardees. Social media can certainly help us get the word out on events and activities, but it can also be a pitfall for our chapters if we don't understand the constraints we have. For example, we can't actively solicit donations on our social media as the internet goes well beyond each chapter's boundaries. But, that doesn't mean we can't tell the world about our activities and how they can help get involved with our mission to support and care for our nations ill and injured Veterans and their families.

Social media can seem both new and scary, but look within your chapters to find someone already active on social media, and they will likely help you run your page. In addition to social media, we also had briefings on the website each chapter has available to them off the national webpage. If your chapter doesn't have one, or it hasn't been updated in years, urge your officers to appoint a new webmaster and spruce that page up to maximize your ability to get information out to your members and the local community. As a reminder, you can also provide information to Department for inclusion on your page on the Department website. None of these items are mandatory of course, but we often sit back and wonder how we can better reach out and these are several ways that other chapters are using with great success.

Update on the Department Flood of 2018



Pulling in to the Home Depot parking lot at 2:30 pm, it's 110 degrees out. I see a veteran with a Korean War cover, just 20' away from me, and go to meet him, wearing my Navy cover.

Me: Hi, Korean War Vet! I'm Paul. Navy.

Vet: I'm Mark. I'll be 89 next week. You're younger than me!

Me: Yes. I'm 66. Nice to meet you, Mark. Some of the veterans in the east valley are organized as Disabled American Veterans. We have a chapter house not far from here. Vet: I tried going to the VA. I said I can't hear good, and they gave me a questionnaire, and then told me I didn't qualify. To (expletive) with the VA.

Me: The D.A.V. isn't the VA. We're advocates for veterans. What did you do in the Army? Vet: I was a cook.

Me: Were you ever in combat?

Vet: No.

Me: But your unit might have been. Would you please go see one of our service officers at the D.A.V. here in Mesa? You might be able to get something done about that hearing after all.

Vet: (blank stare)

Me: It's too hot out here to talk any longer. The heat isn't good for either of us. Please call me when you get home.

Mark is one of thousands out there who may not yet be receiving the benefits they earned, not to mention the camaraderie, support and encouragement veterans receive from one another. I haven't heard back from Mark, but I hope I do, because the well-being of every veteran matters.

During these high temperature months this is a vital service.


Chapter 20 raised this money and the water from Bingo Players. Lori and Kevin Cooper delivered the water on Saturday August 4th.
